## **The New Alliance: Environmental Humanities**

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This project is funded by the *Junta de Extremadura* or Government of the Autonomous Community of Extremadura, Spain, thanks to its international mobility program open to scholars of the University of Extremadura (published in the *DOE* on 20 January 2017). It is also inspired by the aims of the research project *HUAMECO: Relatos para el Cambio* [HUAMECO: Stories for Change] Ref: HAR2015-67472-C2-2-R (MINECO/FEDER), of which I have been a member since its beginning in 2015. HUAMECO's fundamental premise is to effect social change by adopting a transdisciplinary approach based on Environmental Humanities (EH), which constitute a valuable tool of both ecological awareness raising and moral transformation. Its starting point is the empirical confirmation of the contemporary environmental crisis, and its consequences for the current global civilization and the usual way of life in industrialized societies. But most importantly, it also accepts the forecast of sustainability as an ultimate end.

In Spain, there is still a lack of understanding of what Environmental Humanities may bring to the work done by scholars in the humanities and how this can affect the ways in which different stakeholders face the challenges of sustainability. With this in mind, this project aims at finding ways in which to communicate the potential of the field of EH as a tool, which might enhance the creation of empathy spaces where imagination and emotional aspects that are decisive for moral education are cultivated. In this sense, the objective of this project is to find ways of incorporating EH into the Spanish higher education curriculum. This objective is articulated in two main goals:

1) On a scholarly level, I intend to write an article in Spanish on the origins and establishment of the field of EH in Europe using the case of the RCC as a means of illustration. With this, I envision the possibility of establishing the groundwork for the incorporation of more Spanish scholars to EH and recognition of the field by academic institutions and the administration.

2) On an educational and administrative level, I intend to conduct work towards the planning of a postgraduate program to be implemented at the College of Humanities of the University of Extremadura (Cáceres, Spain). The many diverse but individual efforts in this field could herald a successful future for the EH in this geographical area of Spain, which is known for its environmental interest.
